This Indenture, made this 31st day of July in the year of our Lord's choice
one thousand eight hundred and seven, between Joseph Gurnee of the County of Southampton
and parish of Westbury of the one part, and Joseph Harris of the County and parish
of the other part, Mistrs that the said Joseph Gurnee for and in consideration
of the sum of thirty five pounds good and lawful money of England to him in hand
paid by the said Joseph Harris the receipt whereof the said Joseph Gurnee with
his own acknowledge himself fully and amply satisfied and paid, have bargain
sold, alien, conveyed and confirm'd, and by these presents do bargain and sell, alien
convey and confirm unto the said Joseph Harris his heirs and assigns forever one certain
tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County and town of a piece
beginning at a small piece a corner of Joseph Gurnee's Joseph Harris's mare when the
land was survey'd, thence south sixty degrees east fifty poles to a lightwood post
standing in William Allen's lane, thence north 46 degrees east twenty three poles
to a sweet gum standing in the hog pen branch a corner of William Allen's
Joseph Harris, thence up said branch north thirty degrees west sixty eight poles
to a large pine, a corner of John Lister & Joseph Harris, thence north sixty
seven degrees west thirty poles to a pine a corner of Joseph Gurnee, thence south twenty
two degrees west thirty two poles to a large pine in Joseph Gurnee's lane thence south
14 degrees west fifty six poles to the first division - containing by a survey thirty
five acres, with all houses, out houses, edifices, buildings, yards, gardens, orchards, ways
waters and waters bearing, to have and to hold the said land and premises together
with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Joseph Harris his heirs and assigns
forever, and the said Joseph Gurnee for himself his heirs and assigns shall & lawfully warrant and defend the said land and premises
unto the said Joseph Harris his heirs and assigns from all manner
of persons, laying any claim by law or otherwise. Mistrs =
