

312 This Indenture made the ^{15th} day of June 1804 between Simon Drake & Lucy his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part, and John Blythe of the County of Warwick of the other part, Witness that the said Simon Drake & Lucy his wife in consideration of the sum of thirty dollars lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid, have granted bargain'd, sold, and by these presents do grant bargain sell unto the said John Blythe and his heirs, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid, the boundaries of which were fully appear'd by reference to as deeds from John Crickens to said Blythe proved and recorded in the County Court of Southampton containing by intimation thirty seven acres and more or less, to have and to hold, the said tract or parcel of land together with the appurtenances to him the said John Blythe his heirs, and the said Simon Drake & Lucy his wife their and each of their heirs executors, & assigns the said land with the appurtenances to them the said John Blythe his heirs and assigns, shall and well WARRANT and forever defend, In Witness whereof the said Simon Drake & Lucy his wife have hereunto set their hands & seals the day and year above written
