160 acres of Land near Brown ye that whereas the said Rebecca
cannot conveniently travel to the court of our said county to
acknowledge the same therefore we do give to you power to receive
the acknowledgment which the said Rebecca shall be willing
to make before you of the conveyance aforesaid contained in
the said Indenture which is thereto annexed and we do therefore
command you to go personally to the said Rebecca and examine
her privately and apart from her husband whether she hath consented
the said Indenture freely and voluntarily without the persuasion or
threats of her said husband and whether she is willing the said
Indenture should be record in the County Court of S^tampton and
when you have examined her as aforesaid and taken her acknowl-
edgment of the said indenture that you attestedly and openly witness us
thereof under your hands and seals returning to us also this writ
Witness Samuel Veleo clerk of our said court this 26 day of March
