Know all men by these presents, that whereas I, George J. J. Gray of the County of Southampton State of Virginia one of the heirs of Capt. James Gray dec'd. late of the County & State aforesaid am justly entitled to one equal third part of the lands granted to the said James Gray by virtue of a Military Warrant Number two Thousand Six hundred & thirty one as will appear by patents issued to the said James Gray; one for one thousand acres of land lying on the North fork of Paint Creek in the State of Ohio dated April the Sixth Eighteen hundred & two another for one thousand acres and another for nine hundred & eighty four acres lying on the waters of the east fork Little Miami in the State aforesaid and dated as aforesaid another for one thousand acres lying on the Ohio river near the mouth of Cumberland river in the State of Kentucky dated August 7th one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight. Now know ye that I the said George J. J. Gray have made constituted & appointed and by these presents do make constitute & appoint John C. Gray of the County & State aforesaid my true & lawful attorney for me and in my name to dispose of sell grant and convey my said third part of the lands above mentioned absolutely in fee simple for such price or sum of money and to such person or persons as he shall think fit and convenient and also for me and in my name to seal execute & deliver such deeds conveyances bargain & sales for the absolute sale & disposal thereof or of any part thereof as my sd. attorney shall think fit and expedient; hereby ratifying confirming and allowing all such Deeds, Conveyances bargains or sales which shall at any time hereafter be sealed & executed by my said attorney touching or concerning the premises.
