This Indenture made the eighteenth day of May in the year anno domini one thousand eight hundred and seven Between John Underwood senior and Phely his wife of the county of Southampton of the one part and John Wigwheat of the same County of the other part: It witnesseth that the said John Underwood and Phely his wife in consideration of the sum of fifty Dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained & sold; and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said John Wigwheat and his heirs one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the county of Southampton containing by Survey four acres be the same more or less. Beginning at a cypress post standing in a Ditch a few paces South of the Town of Jerusalem a corner of Joshua Forts and the said Wigwheat's land thence North 68 Degrees East 16 pole to a cross Ditch a corner between Cap<sup>t</sup> Josiah Wick John Underwood and the said
