This Indenture made this sixth day of October One Thousand eight hundred and seven Between Harrison Stephenson and Polly his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and William Hancock of the said County of the other part - Witnesseth that the said Harrison Stephenson and Polly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars to them in hand paid by the said William Hancock at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents The Receipt whereof the said Harrison Stephenson and Polly his wife doth hereby acknowledge and themselves therewith fully satisfied and pacified Have bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth hereby bargain sell and confirm unto the said William Hancock
