

and obtained in writing under his or their hands and seals for the purpose
 then and in either of those cases it shall and may be lawful to sue for the
 said Jacob Dander or such other person as may succeed to the care of the
 lands hereby granted into the premises hereby leased, or any part thereof
 in the name of the whole to recover and the same to have again re-
 posess and enjoy as in his or their first and former estate, anything herein
 to the contrary notwithstanding - And the said Henry Bishop
 Ep. 2. and John Bishop do hereby for themselves their executors, administrators
 &c covenant and agree to and with the said Jacob Dander curator as aforesaid
 and with such other person as may succeed him in the case of the
 said lands, his or their heirs or assigns that they the said Henry Bis-
 hop and John Bishop their heirs executors or administrators shall and
 will well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Jacob Dander
 curator as aforesaid or to such, or to such person as may succeed him in the
 case of the said lands, his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns
 the sum yearly next of one hundred and forty Dollars on the days and
 times and in such manner as is herein before appointed for payment
 thereof, according to the several inscriptions thereon aforesaid, at
 the true intent and meaning of these presents; and also the taxes
 aforesaid in time and manner aforesaid - And that the said Henry
 Bishop and John Bishop their executors and administrators shall and
 Ep. 3. hold their own proper rents and charges, will and sufficiently repair
 and forever will keep in repair the fence, now upon the premises and
 such as may be thereto added by them in inclosing the piece of land
 herein after granted to be enclosed and tended and that they will take
 care of the orchard and fruit trees of every kind now on the premises trim
 them manure them as much as convenient and preserve them from
 the caterpillar or other insects which are common to fruit trees, as much
 as they possibly can and that he the said Henry Bishop shall live in
 the dwelling house now on the premises and shall use his utmost endeavor
 to preserve it from injury as from being defaced - He shall partic-
 ularly preserve the floor, wall scuttling, plastering, windows and window glass
 from being broken or injured and as far as possible shall preserve it from
 the ravages of rats and from all dangers buildings on the inside they
 shall pay no attention to the other houses and the paling around the
 gardens and yard so as to prevent them from injury of any sort
