This INDENTURE made this Twenty Eighth day of November one thousand Eight Hundred and Seven Between John Mundell of Southampton County Virginia of the one part and Robert Maby of the said County of the other part witnesseth that the said John Mundell being justly indebted to Henry Smith of the said County in the sum of one hundred and ninety two Pounds Seventeen Shillings and Eight pence Virginia money due by him with lawful interest from this date which he and said Smith still hath in his possession and being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the same to the said Smith in consideration whereof and more over for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged the said John Mundell hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell and make over unto the said Robert Maby his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and in the South side of the flat swamp and bounded as follows - Beginning at the said flat swamp at Turners line thence along said line to the land formerly belonging to Benjamin Harris and thence along said line to the flat swamp thence down said swamp to the beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less to bring the lands wherein the said John Mundell now resides - also one negro woman known by the name of Rose and one negro girl by the name of Lucy they being the only negroes the said Mundell hath now in his possession - to have and to hold the said land and negroes with all appurtenances thereof unto the said Robert Maby his heirs and assigns forever in trust for said Henry Smith his heirs executors etc as assignee for the express purpose of paying the said Henry Smith the sum of one hundred and ninety two pounds Seventeen Shillings and Eight pence the said John Mundell having made this indenture bearing date and being agreed upon and admitted to be the true intent and meaning of this Indenture that if the said sum as above specified be not paid unto the said Henry Smith with all interest thereon or before the twenty fifth day of December ensuing the date hereof then the said Smith shall be at liberty at any time thereafter when it may suit him to sell the said lots or any part thereof still remaining unpaid for to require and compel the said Robert Maby to sell the said land and negroes at public sale for ready money on the premises and the said Robert Maby shall have full power and authority to sell the same having previously advertised the time and place of sale for at least three weeks in the premises and
