

nor other public places in the county convenient to the premises and the said Robert Mabry shall have full power and authority to Convey and make over by deed or Deeds in writing a lawful right and title in fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers of said land and negroes and the said John Mundall his heirs or assigns shall be forever estopped from setting up any claim to the same either in law or equity and the money arising such sale first to be applied to the payment of the said sum and the said sum with all interest and cost accruing and the balance if any to be paid unto the said John Mundall his heirs, assigns or assigns or to the person or persons entitled to receive the same by the Statute of distributions provided always and be it remembered that if the said John Mundall pay the said sum of money with all interest and cost thereon at any time before the said land and negroes be sold in manner as mentioned above then this indenture to be void and all right interest and title herein conveyed shall cease and revert in the said John Mundall his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof the said John Mundall hath hereunto set his hands and affixed his seal this day and year above written signed sealed and delivered in presence of John Mundall Esq Robert Murrell Burth.
