Admors. or assigns or to the person or persons entitled to receive the same by the Statute of distributions, provided always and it is remembered that if the said Richards Barker pay the said sum of money with all interests and costs therein at any time before the said lands are in manner as mentioned above then this Indenture to be void and all right Interest and title herein convey shall revert in the said Richards Barker his heirs and assigns forever In Witnesps whereof the said Richards Barker hath hereunto set his hands and affixed his Seal this day and year above written
