This Indenture made this fourteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and five Between William Jamel and Mary Jamel of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Benjamin Bittle of the same County of the other parts Witnesseth that the said William Jamel and Mary Jamel for and in consideration of the sum of fifty three pounds four shillings current money of Virginia in hand paid by the said Benjamin Bittle at or before the sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said William Jamel and Mary Jamel with hands and seals and thereof acquit and discharge the said Benjamin Bittle his heirs Executors and assigns forever by these presents they the said William Jamel and Mary Jamel hath granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said Benjamin Bittle his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the parish and County aforesaid and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a black jack in John Wrights line and running N 51 W 16 pole to the head of the deep bottom thence down the various Courses of said bottom to an ash a corner of John Wrights Sterling Capells and Jamels thence along the said Capells line of N 134 pole to a white oak a corner of said Capell Jamel and Benjamin Bittle thence along said Bittles line S 8 1/2 W 18 pole to the road thence along said road N 76 E 134 pole to the beginning containing sixty six and four fifths Acres more or less with all woods water water courses profits whatsoever and reversions and reversions remainders and remainders rights issues and profits thereof and all the estate right the interest use trust possessions property benefits claims and demands of them the said William Jamel and Mary Jamel of in and to the same any and every part thereof and all debts evidences and writings touching or concerning the premises - To have and to hold the said plantation tract or parcel of land and premises hereunto before mentioned with the appurtenances unto the said Benjamin Bittle his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said
