and Peggy his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and
Barnew Stephensson of the plantations of the other part Witnesseth
the said William Washington and Peggy his wife for and in con-
sideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy pounds current money
of Virginia to them in hand paid at or before the sealing and
delivering of these presents the receipt whereof the said William
Washington and Peggy his wife doth hereby acknowledge fully
satisfied Contented and paid hath granted granted sold sold
enjoyed and confirmed unto the said Barnew Stephensson and
to his heirs and assigns forever all that tract of Land late purchased
within the appurtenances Situate lying and being in the County of
Southampton Containing by estimation one hundred and fifteen
Acres more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at a point
corner line of William Hancock's line Thence along the said
field branch to an oak adjoining the said Hancock's line to an
oak thence a straight line to the junction thence down the
Swamp called Leacock to a corner of James Clayton's
line to the beginning also all woods underwoods ways waters
