

tended the present year except a small piece which may be necessary to make equal division of the plantations he may sow, on the land when it is not in indian corn such small grain as may be found not to injure it. or he may on the level parts plant pease Cotton or sweet potatoes. He is not to clear any land nor to cut or suffer to be cut or destroyed any timber or other trees on the land, except such as may be necessary for the use of the plantations hereby leased, nor is he to burn or cause to burn any lightwoods for the purpose of making Tar on the premises, but is to use his utmost endeavours to preserve and keep all those things from being wasted or destroyed - And lastly that it shall and may be lawful for him the said Isaac M. Knox (paying the rents herein before reserved and performing the Covenants and agreements herein before mentioned and contained and which on his part or behalf are or ought to be paid done and performed peaceably and quietly to have, hold possess and enjoy the premises hereby leased with the appurtenances privileges & emoluments (except as before excepted) during the term of eight years hereby granted without any molestation or interruption whatever by him the said Jacob Darden Curator as aforesaid or his Successors - or by any person or persons lawfully or equitably claiming or to claim from by or under him or them or any of them - In Witness whereof they the said Jacob Darden Curator for William Everett and Isaac M. Knox have hereunto set their hands & seals this day and date first before Written Signed Sealed & acknowledged

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 15th day of October 1808. This Indenture was acknowledged by Jacob Darden and Isaac M. Knox parties hereto and ordered to be recorded *Jam Wells*

This Indenture made this 15th day of October in the year of our Lords one thousand Eight Hundred and eight between David W. Edmunds of the County of Southampton and parish of St. Luke of the one part and Martha Edmunds of the County and parish aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said David W. Edmunds for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred Dollars good and lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Martha Edmunds herself fully & amply satisfied and paid, doth grant bargain & sell and by these presents have granted bargained and sold unto the said Martha Edmunds her heirs & assigns forever 200 Acres of Land it being a part of the Land where she now lives lying and being in the County and parish aforesaid and bounded as follows (to wit)
