said Piney Grove tract of lands &c and within ten day make
sale of the same for the best price bidden in Cash, and after
having reimbursed to said Bryant to purchase money of said lands
together with the interest thereof & all damages which may
accrue in the case, then, shall proceed to pay to said Whitfield

them in hand paid or otherwise secured before the sealing & delivery
of these presents, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and
granted bargained and sold, & do by these presents grants bargain
and convey unto the said Ethelared Washington and to his
heirs & assigns forever one certain Tract or parcel of land lying and
being in Southampton County aforesaid, & in the south side of the
Seacock Swamp, containing ten & $\frac{1}{3}$ Acres, be the same more or less
marked & bounded as follows: — Beginning at a black gum on the south
side of reddish rose Branch thence N. 35 E. 31 pole to an oak tree
in Jefse Washingtons line thence N. 28 E. 28 pole to a dogwood in
