This Indenture made this twentieth day of February in the year of our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight, between Richard Wick of the
 County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part Samuel Calvert
 of the same County and State of the second part and Samuel Kello of
 the same County & State of the third part - Witnesseth, that whereas
 the said Richard Wick stands jointly indebted to the D. Samuel Calvert
 by a writing obligation under his hands and seal, bearing equal date with these
 presents in the sum of one hundred and fifty four dollars and forty two
 cents in demand and whereas for the further assurance and securing the
 payment aforesaid, it is agreed by the said Richard Wick & Samuel Calvert
 that a bargain in trust shall be made to the said Samuel Kello
 for the benefit of the said Samuel Calvert - now this Indenture therefore
 Witnesseth, that the said Richard Wick, for and in Consideration of the
 premises aforesaid, and for the further consideration of the sum of
 one dollar to the said Richard Wick in hand paid the receipt where-
 of is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained, sold and delivered
 and by these presents, do grants bargain sell and deliver unto the D.
 Samuel Kello two negro Slaves to wit, woman Ginny about twenty three
 years old & her child, ned, about one year old, To have and to hold
 the said Samuel Kello, his heirs and assigns forever - In trust, never-
 theless, and upon these express Conditions that if the said Richard
 Wick, his heirs, execs or administrators, shall pay or cause to be paid
 to the said Samuel Calvert his heirs or assigns the aforesaid sum
 of one hundred and fifty four dollars and forty two cents, and int.
 agreeable to the tenor of the said Bond, on or before the first day of
 January next ensuing the date hereof - then the said Samuel Kello
