the said Richard Vick his heirs &c. shall fail to make payments of
the aforesaid sum of one hundred & fifty four dollars and forty two
cents, with the legal interest & costs, attending the recording these presents
Sale &c. on or before the said first day of January next, as above
then the said Samuel Kello his heirs execs or assigns shall at the
request of the said Samuel Calvert his heirs or assigns, anytime after
giving twenty days notice by advertising at the door of the Court House
of this County, sell at public auction the aforesaid slaves, woman & boy
& boy ned, for ready money, or so much thereof, as will be sufficient to
discharge the debt. Interest and costs, which the said Samuel Kello shall
pay to the said Samuel Calvert, & the overplus if any, to the said Richard
Vick, in testimony whereof the parties to these presents have set
their hands & seals the day and year before written—

This Indenture made this 20th day of April one thousand eight
hundred and eight between Sophia Powell, of the one part, John Whitehead
of the second part and B.W. Johnston of the third part. all of the
County and State of Virginia— Witnesseth that whereas, the said
John Whitehead, has this day become security for the said Sophia
Powell, for the sum of one hundred dollars— made payable to
Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton to the
Sale of the lands belonging to the estate of, Drewry Powell dec'd
Now this Indenture, Witnesseth that the said Sophia Powell
hath for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar to her in hand
paid by the said B.W. Johnston. granted bargained, made, over sold,
conveyed unto him, and his heirs and assigns forever one certain
negro woman, named Annica & her youngest child, Mary also the
interest or dower estate in a certain negro fellow named Anders—
To and for the following use & purposes, upon special trust & covenants
and for the following use or purpose only, that is to say, that
the said Sophia Powell her heirs or assigns fail to pay and
exonerate the said John Whitehead from his security
