This Indenture made this Twenty fourth day of April in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and seven, between Jacob Porter of the County of Southampton of the first part, Henry Blunt of the same County of the second part, and Robert Jones also of the same County of the other part - Witnesseth whereas the said Jacob Porter is justly indebted to the said Robert Jones, by bond, bearing even date with these presents, in the sum of one hundred and Seventy eight pounds current money and being, willing, and desirous to secure to him the payments thereof with interest accruing thereon - Now this Indenture Witnesseth that that the said Jacob Porter in consideration of the premises, and also for the further Consideration of the sum of five shillings to him in hand paid by the said Henry Blunt, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry Blunt his heirs and assigns, one negro man named Aron, Twenty head of cattle two horses, three feather beds and furniture and one Cart and wheels;
