This Indenture made this 17th of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight between John Clayton of the County of Southampton of the one part and John Holmes of the said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Clayton for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred and seventeen pounds twelve shillings & ¹² pence current money of Virginia the payment whereof is secured to the said John Clayton by the said John Holmes by his bond executed to said John Clayton bearing equal date with these presents hath bargained sold released, granted, and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the said John Holmes the following Slaves, goods, and Chattels, to wit, one negro woman Phyllis, two negro men Reliodorus and Charles, one negro woman Nancy, two negro girls Eliza, Mary, & Fanny, and one negro boy James, five feather beds and furniture, four walnut tables, half dozen Windsor chairs, rush bottom chairs, one safe, one Chest of Drawers, one beautifull gun table, one linen wheel, one gun, one looking glass, two dozen earthen plates, half dozen earthen dishes, half dozen bowls, two Coffeepotts, two tea potts, one dozen cups and saucers, one pine chest, three trunks, half dozen pewter dishes, half dozen pewter basins, one dozen pewter plates, two Dutch ovens, half dozen potts, one loom and gear, one gin cart and bottles, one still complete, one apple Mill, half dozen staves, thirty Cider Casks, three head of horses, one yoke of oxen, fifteen head of cattle, twenty one head of sheep, five sows and twenty ~~four~~ ^{sheep}三十 four fat hogs, one hundred barrels of corn, three stacks of top fodder, four stacks of blase fodder, one Cart and wheels, one copper tea Kettle - To have and to hold all and singular the said slaves, goods and chattels, and every of them by these presents, bargained, sold, released, granted and confirmed unto the said John Holmes for his use and behoof of his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, forever, freely, quietly, peaceably and riotously, without any contradiction, claim, disturbance or hindrance of any person whatsoever, and with any account to him the said John Clayton or to any other whoonsoever to be made, answered, or hereafter to be devised, so that neither him the said John Clayton nor any other for him or in his name, any right title interest or demand, of in to or for the said slaves, goods and chattels, or any part or parcels thereof, ought to execute challenge claim or demand at any time or times hereafter, but from all action rights, estate etc claim demand, possession and interest thereof, shall be wholly ~~less~~
