This Indenture made this 17th of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight between John Clayton of the County of Southampton of the one part and John Holmes of the said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Clayton for and in Consideration of the sum of seven hundred and seventeen pounds twelve shillings & six pence Current money of Virginia the payments whereof is secured to the said John Clayton by the said John Holmes, by his bond executed to said John Clayton, bearing equal date with these presents hath bargained sold released, granted, and Confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell release and Confirm unto the said John Holmes the following Slaves, goods, and Chattles (to wit) One negro woman Phillis, two negro men Nichodemus and Charles, one negro woman Nancy, two negro girls, Eliza, Mary, & Fanny, and one negro boy James, five feather beds and furniture, four walnut tables, half Dozen winson Chairs, some rush bottom Chairs, one safe, one Chest of Drawers, one beauty, one Gum table, one Linen wheel, one Gun, one looking glass, two dozen earthen plates, half dozen earthen dishes, half dozen bowls, two Coffee pots, two Tea pots, one dozen cups and saucers, one pine Chest, three trunks, half dozen pewter dishes, half dozen pewter basins, one dozen pewter plates, two Dutch ovens, half dozen pots, one loom and gear, one Gin barrel and bottles, one Still complete, one Apple Mill, half dozen staves, thirty Cider Casks, three head of horses, one Yoke of Oxen, fifteen head of Cattle, twenty one head of sheep, five Sows and twenty four sheeps, thirty four fat hogs, one hundred barrels of Corn, three stacks of top fodder, four stacks of blase fodder, one Cart and wheels & one Copper tea Kettle - To have and to hold all and singular the said Slaves goods and chattles, and every of them by these presents, bargained, sold, released, granted and Confirmed unto the only proper use and behoof of this said John Holmes, his executors administrators, and assigns, forever, freely, quietly, peaceably and intirely, without any Contradiction, claim, disturbance or hindrance of any person whatsoever, and with any accounts to him the said John Clayton or to any other whomsoever to be made, answered or hereafter to be rendered, so that neither him the said John Clayton nor any other for him or in his names any right title interest or demand, of in to or for the said Slaves, goods and Chattles, or any parts or parcels thereof, ought to execute Challenge Claim or demand at any time or times hereafter, but from all action right, title, title claim demand, possession and interest thereof, shall be wholly barred.
