This Indenture made this 9th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine between Valentine Linkins, Jacob Turner & Robert Mercer Commissioners appointed by the honourable Courts of Southampton of the one part and Benjamin Drew son of William Boykin of the other part— Witnesseth that the said Valentine Linkins, Jacob Turner and Robert Mercer Commissioners &c for and in Consideration of the sum of one hundred and eighty pounds six shillings Current money of Virginia to them secured by bond with security by William Boykin before the said and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof we the said Commissioners do hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold aliened released & confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien release and confirm into the said Benjamin Drew son of William Boykin for the benefit of the heirs of said Boykin agreeable to his last will and Testament one certain Tract of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton on the east side of Seacock Swamp and near the lower Seacock bridge containing two hundred acres more or less, its being all the land the Wright died seized and possessed of, which said land was devised to him by his father Joseph Wright and bounded as follows by the lines of Wm Lynes Deceased, William Crumpler, & Wm Boykin—
