

to go personally to the said Mary and examine her privately & apart from her husband whether she hath executed the said deed freely and voluntarily without the persuasion or threat of her husband and whether she is willing the said Incutment should be recorded in the County Court of our said County, and when you have examined her as aforesaid, and taken her acknowledgements of the same that you distinctly and openly Certify us thereof, under your hands and seals, returning to us also this writ with the said Incutment annexed, Witness Samuel Kello Clerk of our said Court at the Chancery the 17th day of October 1807, and in the 3rd year of the Commonwealth - Sam. Kello C.

By Virtue of this writ to us directed from the County Court of Southampton we did personally go to the within named Mary and examine her privately and apart from her said Husband, & before us she freely acknowledged the said Incutment & relinquished her rights of Inheritance and in the Lands therein Contained, and that she was Willing the same should be recorded in the County Court of Southampton of which we are Clerk, the Justices of the said Court under our hands and seals this 15th day of November 1807 - J. G. Lacey Seal
