This Indenture made this thirteenth day of June in the year
 of our Lord eighteen hundred and nine Between Giles Johnson of the County
 of Southampton of the one part, and Jonathan Luter of the same County
 of the other part (witnesseth) that the said Giles Johnson, for and in Consi-
 deration of the sum of three hundred & ninety six dollars Current Money of
 Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Jonathan Luter the receipt whereof
 of he doth hereby acknowledge himself fully, and amply Satisfied, and,
 paid, hath granted, bargained, sold alienated Released, and Confirmed and by
 these presents doth grant bargain &c unto the said Jonathan Luter his heirs
 and assigns forever, all that plantation, tract or parcel of Land, and
 premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging, now in the ten-
 ure and Occupation of the said Jonathan Luter, lying and being in the
 aforesaid County of Southampton containing ninety nine acres more or less
 and Bounded as follows (To wit) beginning at Post Oak a corner
 two in John Lawrences line thence north 61 degrees west 14 1/2 Poles to a
 light wood Post in John Luters line thence north 32 deg: east 32 Poles to
 a pine standing in the head of a small Branch thence a variation
 from the pine aforesaid down the said Branch the different courses thereof
 to the road ~~and~~ leading from Corps Bridge to Black water Bridge
