This Indenture made this 30th day of December in
 the year of our lord 1807. Between Cordall Brantley of Southampton
 County and State of Virginia of the one part and Etheldred Hart of South-
 ampton County and State of N^o Carolina of the other part, Witnesseth
 that the said Etheldred Hart & his wife Lucy for and in Consideration
 of the sum of fifty three pounds Current money of Virginia to them in
 hand by the said Cordall Brantley at and before the making &
 delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof of the said Etheldred Hart
 & his wife Lucy do hereby acknowledge and thereof do acquit the said
 Cordall Brantley his heirs Executors & administrators have bargained
 & do by these presents for us and our heirs forever sell and deliver
 unto him the said Cordall Brantley his heirs Executors & assigns forever
 One Certain tract, parcel or Divided Land lying in the County of South-
 ampton and State of Virginia & on the North Side of the Craig Branch
 Containing seventy nine & 3/4 Acres more or less and bounded as follows:—
 Beginning at a large forked pine standing side of the cornfields
 fence running a South Course to a poplar standing in the Craig
 Branch, then up the said branch to a dogwood then long a line
 of marked trees to the Corner of Williams Edmunds line in the Cor-
 nish Branch, then down the said Branch to the Corner tree
 a Sassafras, then a east Course up the fence to the Corner of the said
 fence now running a South Course to the Corner of the apple orchard
 there a west Corner to a Small Branch, then down the said Branch
 to a Stopped pine then east Course to a corner pasture then a
 South to the beginning; To Have and to hold the aforesaid
 Tract of Land together with all privileges is and
