now, shall or may have, or claim of in or to the said premises menti-
oned aforesaid and expressed so that neither I the said Joseph
Benson Esq^r as aforesaid his heirs Ex^{ts} & adm^{rs} at any time here-
after, shall, or will claim, any right, title interest or demand, in
any manner whatsoever in the before mentioned tract of land, or concer-
ning the same, shall be forever barred by these In witness where-

This Indenture made this 19 February in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten Between Amos
Drewitt and Sally his wife of the one part and Betsy Joyner of the
other Witnesseth that the said Amos Drewitt and Sally his
