This Indenture made on the 13th Day of
July in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and nine between
Samuel Kello of the town of Jerusalem of the first part John M^{rs} of
part of the County of Southampton of the second part and Joshua Fort
of the third part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of
two hundred and twenty five pounds nine Shillings and eight pence
which he the said Samuel Kello stands justly indebted to the said John
M^{rs} surviving partner of Ruffin and M^{rs} and Honorable disres
to receive and pay to him; and for and in consideration of the sum of five
Shillings five pence to the said Samuel Kello in hand paid by the said
Joshua Fort trustee chare by the parties at and before the sealing and
doling the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge; and thereof,
and of every part thereof, do is exonerate and discharge the said Joshua
Fort Trustee his heirs, executors and administrators, and the said Samuel
Kello both grantor, bargain, sold, and confirmed, and by these presents
doth grant, bargain, sell, and confirm, to the said Joshua Fort
Trustee his heirs, and assigns forever all right title interest and
claim to the one half of two undivided Lots situate in the town
of Jerusalem, known and distinguished in the plan of the said
Town by the numbers eighteen and nineteen being the same two
lots now occupied by him the said Samuel Kello also the following
Negroes to wit Cary, Molly, Fanny, Harriet, Rose, Martha, and
Maria with all the appurtenances belonging, or in any wise appertaining
