to wit Samell, Sam, York, Fordyce, Betty and Chlo, Chlo, Sue, Jany
Nomm & Alfred and all their increase, with all and singular the other
property therein Specified, to them the said Sam & Elizabeth & their
heirs forever and I the said William Mafsenburg doth for myself my
heirs executors administrators and assigns hereby relinquish and give up all
the power and powers and Authority especially the trust and trusts in me
vested by the aforesaid recited deed, and I do hereby declare that the aforesaid
recited property that is to say the negroes and their increase with all and every
other species of property now in the possession of the said Samuel Blunt and
Elizabeth his wife which is mentioned in the aforesaid recited deed and therein
conveyed to me upon the special trust and Confidence therein inserted to be
forever free and clear of and from all Authority power or powers and controul
of me the said William Mafsenburg and my heirs and assigns forever
