 and to hold the said thirty four and a half acres, of land together
 with all its privileges and advantages whatsoever to the said land with
 the appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and also all
 estate right title property or claim which either the said Moses Spence Abrah-
 am Eason and Cecilia his wife or the said Jacob Richs their Attorney
 hath in or to the aforesaid land either by law or equity: and the said Jacob
