 greeting whereas John Negubart and Nancy his wife have by their ^{pt}
 Indenture of bargain & sale dated the 16 day of June 1810 conveyed
 unto Benjamin Hines of the county of Southampton the fee simple
 estate of and in _____ acres of Land and whereas the said Negubart
 cannot conveniently ^{travel} to the court of our said county to acknowledge the same
 therefore we do give to you power to receive the acknowledgment which the
 said Nancy Negubart shall be willing to make before you of the convey-
 -ance aforesaid contained in the said Indenture which is hereto annexed and we do
 Command you to go personally to the said Nancy Negubart and examine
 her privately and apart from her said husband whether ^{she} has executed the said
 deed freely and voluntarily without the persuasion or threat of her said husband
 and whether she is willing the same should be recorded in the Court of
 of Southampton and when you have examined her as aforesaid and taken her
 Acknowledgment of the same that you distinctly and openly certify as
 of under your hands & seals returning to us also this writ with the
