This Indenture was acknowledged by George Newsum, Clerk of the Court and with a Commissioner the party examination of Mrs Martha Newsum and a witness of its execution returned and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made this 7th Day of April

in the year of our lord 1810 Between Arthur Washington and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and William Hancock of said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Arthur Washington for and in consideration of the sum one hundred & twenty four pounds ten Shillings to him in hand paid by the said Hancock the receipt whereof the said Washington doth hereby acknowledge have bargained & sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said William Hancock one hundred & twenty four and a half acres of land being the same more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and whereon the said Arthur Washington now lives & bounded as follows to wit— Beginning at a white oak a corner tree in the old pond branch thence down the said branch to the sea cock swamp thence down the ^{said} ~~sea cock~~ ^{branch} to the mouth of the deep Branch thence up the said deep branch to the Valentine Branch ^{along} a straight line marked trees to the beginning with all and every of the appurtenances therunto belonging unto the said William Hancock his heirs and assigns forever— To have and to hold the said land and premises before mentioned unto him the said William Hancock his heirs & assigns forever and the said
