 Jackson and Ephraim Tice acting executors of James Wilkinson
 deceased of the one part and Nathaniel Wilkinson of the other
 all of the County of Sampson, Witnesseth that the said James Jackson
 and Ephraim Tice out as aforesaid for and in consideration of the
 sum of four thousand five hundred and twenty four pounds
 nine shillings to them paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 have given granted, and sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these
 presents do give grant and confirm, alien, enfeoff unto the said
 Nathaniel Wilkinson, his heirs and assigns forever, three several tracts or
 parcels of land, all adjoining the one called West plain, and
 Beals, and the third Commode, the whole containing eight hundred
 and three acres & one half lying in the County aforesaid on the
 main river and bounded as follows Beginning at a dogwood
 tree North 15° West 70 poles to a dogwood tree North
