This Indenture made this twenty first day of
November in the Year of Our Lord Christ one thousand Eight hundred
and ten between Thomas Fitzhugh his wife Nancy Fitzhugh of Southampton
County in Virginia of the one part and Sir Walter of the abovesaid County
of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Fitzhugh his wife
for and in consideration of the Sum of eight hundred and twenty Shillings
current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Sir Walter
at and before the making and delivery whereof the said Thomas Fitzhugh
and Nancy his wife both hereby acknowledged, sold aliened conveyed
and made over unto the said Sir Walter his heirs and assigns forever
all that tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County
of Southampton and on the South side of Mattoway River
