

This Indenture made this 17th Day of November 1810
between Elisha Harrell and his wife Sarah Harrell of Southampton
County of the one part and Jesse Browne of the said County
of the other part Witnesses it is, that the said Elisha Harrell and his wife
Sarah Harrell for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred
and fifty dollars to them in hand paid by Jesse Browne the receipt
of which they do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold & delivered
and by this present do bargain sell and deliver unto them the
said Jesse Browne his heirs and assigns to have
and to hold forever a tract of land containing one hundred acres
more or less being a part of the land the said E Harrell purchased
of Joseph Northworthy and bounded as follows. Beginning at
a large white oak a corner in Harrells line thence along said line S $63\frac{1}{2}$ W 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ pole
E 24 pole to an elm tree near a branch, thence S 51° E 100 to a
oak line one thence along the old line to the beginning a first station which
said tract of land with all its appurtenances the said Elisha Harrell and
his wife Sarah Harrell in behalf of themselves and their heirs do warrant
and will forever defend against the claim or claims of all persons
present or future whomsoever to him the said Jesse Browne his heirs
and assigns to have and to hold forever. In Witness whereof
