Witnesseth that the said Howard Jones, Heyder & Davis and
Elizabeth Turner his wife and James Cairn and Nancy his wife,
for and in the consideration of the sum of one thousand four
hundred & fifty one dollars and eighty four cents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained sold alien
infeoffed and confirmed, and by these do grant bargain sell
alien, infeoff and confirm unto the said Henry Blunt his heirs and
assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the
County of Southampton and state of Virginia aforesaid on
Mechum's river containing by estimation eleven hundred and eighty
six acres, be the same more or less, and bounded as follows, beginning
at a large gum in the County line on the bank of the Mechum's
river; thence on east, come along the County line to corner
white Oak in Edmund Turners line, thence a straight line
to Edmund Turners place known by the name of Arliss; thence
continuing his line to the mouth of the prason branch to a corner
tree between the said Edmund Turner and the aforesaid Henry
Blunt thence along the said Henry Blunt's line to a pine
corner between the said Henry Blunt, and Davis Day thence along
the said Davis Days line down Brownes branch to a gum in the
great meadow in the head thereof another corner between the said
Blunt & Day; thence down the meadow to a ditch; thence down
the said Henry Blunt's line to Henry Smiths line coming at
a gum in the great Swash at the said Smiths Causeway thence
along Smiths line to the beginning - it being the land conveyed by
