 hereby acknowledged have bargained ^{and sold} and by the presents do and each of them
 doth bargain and sell unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs and
 assigns a certain tract ^{or part} of land lying and being in the County of Southampton
 on the South side of the three creeks and bounded as follows, Beginning
 at an ash a corner of Martha Williamson's land on the side of
 the main run of said creek running south thirty two degrees west fifty
 pole thence South one degree east fourteen pole thence South forty degrees
 East thirty six pole thence South twenty four degrees East one hundred &
 one pole to a black gum thence South sixty seven degrees East twenty
 four pole thence South twenty degrees East twenty two pole thence South
 sixty degrees East thirty four pole thence South thirty nine degrees East
 forty five pole to the road thence South fifty seven degrees West
 twenty eight pole thence South thirty seven degrees West twenty pole
 to a post oak in George Joy's line thence North fifty six degrees
