This Indenture made this twenty three  
Day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and ten between Jeremiah Beal of the county of Southampton and  
Parish of Totterdown of the one part and Joseph Dewson of the  
same county and Parish of the other part Witnesseth that the said  
Jeremiah Beal for and consideration of the just and full sum of  
eighty one pounds twelve shillings by the said Joseph Dewson to him in  
hand paid before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt  
whereof the said Jeremiah Beal doth hereby acknowledge and thereby  
acquits and discharge the said Joseph Dewson his heirs and assigns  
forever and themselves hereunto fully and entirely satisfied  
and paid him the said Jeremiah Beal hath granted bargained  
sold aliened conveyed released delivered confirmed and confirmed  
by these presents doth grant bargain alien convey release deliver  
and confirm unto the said Joseph Dewson and to his heirs and assigns  
forever all that plantation meadow marsh tract and parcel situate  
whereabouts now lies situate lying and being in the County of Southampton  
and Parish of Totterdown containing by estimation  
nearly one hundred acres be the same more or less comprising all the lands  
which afore said and was assigned to the said Jeremiah Beal
