 18th This Indenture was shewed by the Oath of Thomas Branch
 James Clayton two of the witnesses here and contents—
 And at a court held for the county aforesaid the 21st day of January
 1811 This Indenture was further proved by the Oath of John Branch
 Witness here and ordered to be recorded—

Hony
Jones* This Indenture made this sixteenth day March
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eleven
 between Henry Blunt of the County of Southampton— of the one
 part, and Robert Jones of the said County of the other part—
 that for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred and sixty
 eight dollars and thirty four cents in hand paid the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, the said Henry Blunt hath granted bargained and
 sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Robert
 Jones his heirs and assigns one certain tract piece or parcel of land situate
 lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton on the north
 side of Meherrin river containing two hundred and fifty and a
 quarter acres by survey by the same more or less (and bounded as
 follows beginning at a sweet gum in the state line on the bank
 of the said river (Henry Smiths Corner) thence north eighty six and
 a half degrees East, along the said state line to Edmund Turners
 line in the middle of the great Swank; thence a north west
 course up the same a few poles to a corner; thence a north east
 direction along the various courses of a new chopped line between the said
 Jones & Turner to a corner black gum; thence along the said Turners line
 north thirty three degrees East to the said Turners and Blunts corner
 in the said Turners line; thence along the various courses of the said Blunts
 line, down the parson to a sweet gum or branch at an old
 path; thence down the courses of the said branch to the great swank
 aforesaid; thence up the said swank to a large Cypress near or
 exactly where the gate (Henry Smiths line) runs of the same to the river
 thence down the said gum as it meanders to the beginning—
 Together with all and singular the appurtenances therunto in anywise
 or in anywise appertaining unto the said the said Robert Jones
 his heirs and assigns I have and to hold, the said tract of land
 and premises with the reversion and reversions remain due and owing
