This Indenture made the 12th day of June 1809 between Giles Johnson and William Coggin and Jonathan later trustee both of the County of Southampton In consequence of a debt due to said Giles Johnson by said Coggin and that the said Coggin doth hereby acknowledge himself his heirs executors or assigns to be justly indebted to Giles Johnson his heirs or assigns the sum of seventy five dollars and 62 cents current money of Virginia being for balance of him on demand the 1st day of March 1811 and he secures the payment of the debt above mentioned to said Wm. Coggin doth by these presents agree bargain and sell over in full simple unto Giles Johnson and Jonathan later trustee all that parcel of land and premises situate lying and being in the County of Southampton and Parish of St. Andrew (to wit) Beginning at a lighted post & corner in the line between the lands running thence
