 whole time or term aforesaid and the said James Barnes on his
 part doth hereby covenant promise and agree to teach and instruct
 or cause to be taught and instructed the said Sarah in the art
 trade or mystery of a spinner by the best way or means he
 can, and shall well and faithfully feed & provide for the said
 apprentice good and sufficient meat, drink clothing, lodging
 & other necessaries fit and convenient for such an apprentice
 during the term aforesaid, and two sets of Sunday clothes and
 other working clothes each year during the said term
