peace greeting wheresoever Benjamin Jones and Patsey Jones have by  
this certain Indenture of bargain and sale dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of  
March 1811 come into James Jones of the County of Southampton  
the said simple estate and in 1870 acres of land and where as the  
said parties cannot conveniently travel to the said County of  
Said County to acknowledge the same therefore we do give to you  
power to receive the acknowledgements which the said Patsey  
Jones shall be willing to make before you of the foregoing  
aforesaid contained in the said Indenture which is thereto annexed  
and we do therefore command you to go personally to the said Patsey  
Jones and receive her acknowledgement of the same and examine  
her privately and apart from her husband whether she hath  
executed the said deed freely and voluntarily without the persuas  
ion or threats of her husband and whether she is willing the same  
should be recorded in the County Court of Southampton and  
when you have examined her as aforesaid and taken her acknowl  
edgement of the said Indenture that you affix your hands and seals thereto  
witness as hereof under your hands and seals returning to us  
also this writ with the said Indenture annexed to Mr. John S.  
Kelloe Clerk of our said court at his office the 18<sup>th</sup> day of  
March 1811 and in the 35<sup>th</sup> year of the Commonwealth
