At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 1st day of March 1811 This Indenture was proved by the Oaths of William Wren and Charles Stephens one of the witnesses hereto and with a Commission for the jury examination of Mr James and a certificate of its execution returned and continue and at a Court held for said County the 15th day of April 1811 This Indenture was acknowledged by Robert James party thereto and ordered to be recorded

This Indenture made the 17th day of May 1810 Between Samuel Browne and his wife Martha Browne of the County of Southampton of the one part, and Jesse Browne of the said County of the other part Witnesseth, that the said Samuel and Jesse Browne & his wife Martha for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred to them in hand have bargained transferred made over and delivered by these presents do bargain sell transfer make over & deliver unto the said Jesse Browne a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being the County of Southampton on the South side of railway river bounded as follows Beginning at a small cypress tree on the river about 50 yards below the ferry landing, being the corner tree made by the Commissioners who divide the lands of the late (Sir) Samuel Browne among his heirs) which divides Lot No 6 from No 7 thence from that corner cypress nearly a west course to a large Oak on the hill being a short soft line in the said line about 200 yards to a Chethamquam post, being a corner post thence nearly a north course along a straight line of post 150 yards to a small Spring run in a bottom (the said post was lately placed by the said Samuel & Jesse) thence along the said Spring run nearly an east course to a part of railway river called the cove, thence down the said river to the first station containing by estimation six acres more or less it is a part of that tract
