fourteen Between Arthur Adams and Elizabeth his wife of the one
part and Thomas Applegate of the same County of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Arthur Adams and Elizabeth his wife
for and in Consideration of the sum of twenty three pounds
fifteen shillings current money to them in hand paid by the said
Thomas Applegate the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge
they the said Arthur Adams and Elizabeth his wife have granted
bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and
sell alien and confirm unto him the said Thomas Applegate
and his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of land joining
the land of John Reese Sally Reese and the said Thomas
Applegate land and is bounded as follows to wit, Beginning
at the said Applegates mill dam thence running up the road
one hundred and twenty pole to a hickory in Sally Reeses line
north four degrees west fifty one pole to a pine stump thence
north thirty one degrees east sixty one pole to a dead oak on
a branch thence down the said branch to the mill pond
thence down the mill pond to the beginning containing
eighty four acres be the same more or less and in the land

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
