

now the aforesaid County of Southampton, between Mathew Myrick, and  
the three weeks, being a part of the land, in the said County of  
Southampton which fell to Edmund Myrick (of whom the said  
David Myrick some times past purchased it) by the death of  
his father John Myrick and which said land was held by his mother  
Martha Myrick, in part of her dower during her life, containing  
twenty two acres the same more or less and bounded as  
follows Beginning at a corner gum in the said Harris line  
thence South thirty degrees West Seven and three quarters poles  
to a black gum; thence South fifty four degrees East, Sixty seven  
poles; thence north thirteen degrees East fifty three poles, to a sapling  
in the said Harris line; thence South eighty five degrees West  
Sixty two poles to the beginning; Together with all and singular the  
tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging, or in  
any manner appertaining; and the reversions and reversion  
remainders and remainders, rents issues, and profits thereof unto the  
said James Harris his heirs and assigns To have and to hold the  
said land and premises with the rights usages and privileges which  
are by Law custom or prescription attaches to real estates in  
fee simple, unto the said James Harris his heirs and assigns  
and the said David Myrick for himself and his heirs heirs  
Covenants to warrant and defend the legal rights and title  
of the said land and premises and the appurtenances thereof  
against the claims and demands of every person and persons  
whatsoever unto the said James Harris his heirs and assigns  
for ever In Witness whereof the said David Myrick  
hath hereunto set his hand and seal the date above written
