to Seth Nicholson the said Coffey hath this twenty ninth day
of September Eighteen hundred & ten paid one Benjamin Lewis
as trustee for the said Seth Nicholson, the sum of sixteen hundred some
Shillings & 7 pence and Cost & being a balance due in full of a bond
of eighty five pounds thirteen Shillings & 11 3/4 pence in said deed
in trust bearing date the eight day of January eighteen hundred
and eight and due the eight of June 1809 as well appears by the
said above named deed in trust and the said Benjamin Lewis att
for the Constitution of the above named sum give this as legal release
to the said Graham Coffey to all the property named in said deed in
trust (To wit) one tract or parcel of land containing 5 3/4 acres
and buy more two feather beds and furniture and black Walnut
Table and ^{one} half dozen rush bottomed chairs, one painted
chest and trunk one corn and Hurrey Shop and Tools and
Iron pot Tea Kete dutch oven Spider and Shells one spinning
wheel and every species of property whatsoever to have and to
hold to him the said Coffey and his heirs forever In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the year and
date above written

This Indenture made the twenty eight day of

March In the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and
thirteen between James Harris (Capt) of the County of Southampton
of the one part and David Myrick of the said County of the other part
Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred
and thirty dollars and eight cents in hand paid, the receipt whereof is
herby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents
doth grant bargain and sell unto the said David Myrick his heirs and assigns
a certain piece of land, lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton, between
Muhurin river and the three creeks, being a part of land in the said
County of Southampton which fell to James Myrick of whom the said
