The Commonwealth of Virginia to Carr Powers & James Clayton Subscribers
 Justices of the peace greeting whereas James Jones and Betty his wife
 have by their certain Indenture of Bargain and sale dated the 27th day of
 April 1811 Conveyed unto Joseph W. Ballou of the County of Gloucester
 the fee simple estate of and in 100 acres of land and where as the said
 Betty Jones cannot conveniently travel to the Court of our said County
 to acknowledge the same therefore we do give to you power to receive
 the acknowledgement which the said Betty Jones shall be willing to
 make before you of the Conveyance aforesaid contained in the said
 Indenture which is hereto annexed and we do therefore command
 you to personally to the said Betty Jones and receive her acknowledgement
 of the same and examining her privately and apart from her husband whether
 she hath executed the said deed freely and voluntarily without the per-
 suasion or threats of her husband and whether she is willing the
 same should be recorded in the County Court of Southampton and when
 you have examined her as aforesaid and taken their acknowledgments
 of the said Indenture that you distinctly and plainly certify thereunder
 under your hands and seals returning to us also this writ with the
 said Indenture annexed Witness Samuel Kellogg Clerk of our said Court
 at his Office the 18th day of March 1811 in the 35th year of the
 Commonwealth.
