This Indenture made the first day of October, in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten Between  
Edmund Turner and Rebekah his wife of the County of Southampton  
state of North Carolina of the one part and Henry Smith of  
the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the other part  
Witnesseth, that the said Edmund Turner and Rebekah his  
wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand and four  
hundred and twenty four dollars, to them in hand paid  
before the making hereof by the said Henry Smith, the receipt  
whereof they do hereby acknowledge, and themselves therewith  
fully satisfied and contented, and thereof, and of every part  
and parcel thereof, do exonerate, acquit and discharge him  
the said Henry Smith his heirs executors and administrators, forever  
by these presents, have given granted bargained sold alien conveyed  
and confirmed: and by these presents do freely, fully and absolute give  
grant bargain sell, alien, convey and confirm unto the said Henry  
Smith, his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land,  
situate, lying and being in the County of Southampton and state of  
Virginia and bounded as follows Beginning at a Swash in the  
beginning the said Edmund Turner and Rebekah his wife  
North Carolina line across the plantation to an other Swash  
in Thomas Branch's line thence north eighty eight degrees east one  
hundred and eighteen poles to a pine thence north nineteen degrees east  
two hundred and thirteen poles to a pine, thence south seventy seven  
degrees west twenty poles to a dogwood, thence north twenty seven  
degrees west twenty seven poles to a white Oak, thence south eighty  
degrees west one hundred and twenty eight poles to a red Oak  
thence south eighty six and a half degrees west eighty three poles  
to a Spanish Oak, thence north nineteen and a half degrees west  
fifty four poles to a dead firs, thence south twenty five degrees  
west thirty seven poles to a willow Oak, thence South fourteen degrees  
west sixty three poles to a pine, thence South sixty one degrees  
east twenty five poles to a hickory thence South twenty five degrees  
west fifty nine poles to a red Oak thence along the Swash to the  
Beginning. It being the Virginia part of the land formerly the  
property of Arthur Slater decd. and contains three hundred &  
thirty six acres, be the same More or less. I do have and  
to hold the said grants and bargained premises with all the appur-  
tenances, privileges and commodities, to the same belonging, or in
