This Indenture made the 17th day of March in the year
1811 Between William Blow of the one part and John Underwood
of the other part both of Southampton County and state of
Virginia Witnesseth that the said William Blow for and in consideration
of the sum of thirty seven hundred and twenty dollars the receipt
whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof Acquits & discharges
the said the said John Underwood s^{er} his heirs executors admors
and himself to be thenceforth fully Contented satisfied and paid hath
granted bargained sold and delivered and by these presents hath grant
bargain sold alien enfeoffed set over delivered and confirmed unto him
the said John Underwood s^{er} One certain tract and parcel of
land called and known by the name of the old quarter with said
tract of land was devised to him the said William by John
Thomas Blow dec^d as reference to his will being had which is proven
and recorded in Southampton County Court the devise and title
will fully appear which said tract of land lies in the County
and state aforesaid And on the South side of Mottoway River
and contains by survey six hundred and twenty acres of land
and is bounded as follows to wit Beginning at the intersec-
tion of the branch called Solaim branch running thence
down the said branch the various courses thereof to the Mill
pond called Colonel Blow mill pond thence the various
courses of the high water mark of the said Mill pond to which
standing in Amos Stephenson line running thence along the
said Stephenson line N 40° West 128 pole to a red Oak a corner
of said Stephenson thence N 57° E 68 pole to a dead Oak
standing in said Stephenson line thence N 70° E 39 pole
thence N 74° W 76 pole to a white Oak a corner in said
Stephenson line thence N 33° W 16 pole to a post Oak thence
N 50° W 72 pole to a hickory a corner of Amos Stephenson line
thence South 57° W 160 pole to a up Oak a corner in John
Underwood line thence N 14° W 164 pole thence N 5° E 44 pole
to the Beginning together with all and singular the woods, ways
waters and water courses houses, edifices buildings, yards gardens
Orchards, Mines, Minerals, and the profits and emoluments arising
therefrom, also the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders
with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging
Or in anywise appertaining To have and to hold the said
tract of land, together with all the said John Underwood s^{er}
