 that neither I the said John Fort my Exec or admors shall or will avell  
 claim or demand any Interest use benefit or trust whatever  
 by reason of the said first recited Indenture but thereof & therefrom  
 all actions suits and demands which I may hereafter Exec or admors  
 may have concerning the same shall be utterly Excluded and forever

ation of the sum of two thousand Dollars to him in hand paid at

or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt

whereof they do hereby acknowledge and Confess have granted bargained

& sold with these presents do grant bargain & sell unto the said

James Hammett his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or

parcel of land containing three hundred sixty two and an half acres

in the same more or less lying part in the County of Sussex and part

in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows Beginning

at a white Oak on the side of a branch a corner of the said Henry  
 Parkers other Land thence along the various courses of the said branch to  
 a dead pine standing in the woods of another branch thence  
 along the various courses of the same to a maple in Mary Haines  
 and line thence by his line North 48 West 28 Pole to a hickory
