This Indenture made this ninth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven between Richard B. Keller, Eliza Mc his wife and Sally Adams of the County of Southampton of the one part and William Washington of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Richard B. Keller, Eliza Mc his wife and Sally Adams for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and eighty five Dollars to them in hand paid by the said William Washington, and before the enclosing & delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William Washington his heirs and assigns a certain piece of land lying and being in the County of Southampton on the South Side of the Lightwoods Swamp containing by a late Survey forty six acres and a quarter bounded as followeth — Beginning at a pine near
