and in consideration of the sum of One thousand Dollars
to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of
them doth bargain & sell unto the said George B. Cobb his
heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing
by a late Survey One hundred fifty three and one half acres
