This Indenture made this 21st day of March in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and twelve between Amos Stephenson of the County and parish aforesaid of the other part Witness etc that the said Amos Stephenson for divers good causes and more especially for the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Charles Stephenson that the said Amos Stephenson doth hereby bargain grant give and sell over by these presents that granted bargained given Solover enforce and confirmed unto the said Charles Stephenson one certain tract or parcel of land and premises whereon the said Charles Stephenson now lives containing by a late survey by the county Surveyor one hundred and seventy acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a small red oak in Amos Stephenson's line running thence north 59 East 126 Poles to a maple in Amos Stephenson's line thence North 30 degrees West 23 poles to a large maple in Amos Stephenson's line thence North 70 degrees West 39 poles to a small
